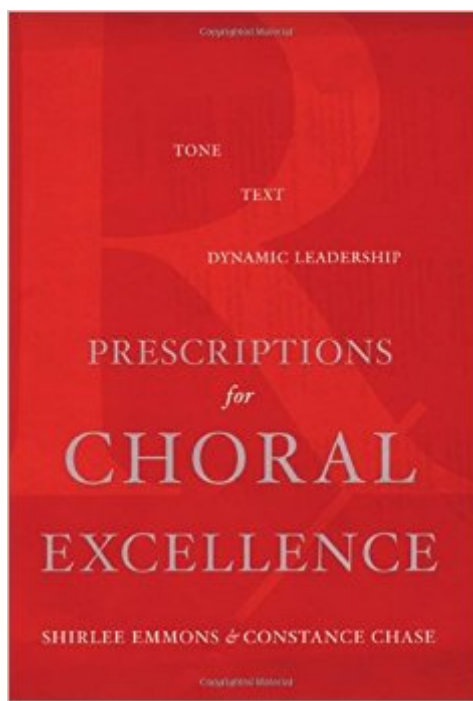

This is a book that belongs on the shelves of every choral director. It's the one book that I use when preparing for every rehearsal. The authors present the material in a meticulously-researched, scientific manner. If your choir has a specific problem that needs to be fixed, this is the book to consult. The solutions are presented methodically and thoroughly, and everything I have used from this book has been a success with my choir. The focus is on solving choral problems through a greater understanding of vocal anatomy and physiology--that's what I love about this book. Too many other books of this type use an abstract, unscientific approach to vocal pedagogy. This is a book I'll use my whole life!!

As soon as I had a chance, I started using the techniques in my rehearsals with my high school choir. It has been about a month since I received the book, and already they sound better. It is because of several different things. 1. I am not able to better diagnose the problems that I hear in the choir because I know possible things they are doing incorrectly and 2.
